

Section 175 Audits



Section 175 of the Education Act 2002 requires school governing bodies, local education authorities and further education institutions to make arrangements to safeguard and promote the welfare of children. This includes reviewing safeguarding policies and procedures annually.

In order to assure the Berkshire West Safeguarding Children Partnership (BWSCP) that schools are discharging their safeguarding responsibilities appropriately schools are required to complete an annual audit.

This year, Reading used the NSPCC audit in line with local partners

All 66 Reading schools returned an audit including Reading College and local independent schools

Analysis



The audit has four safeguarding standards to review:

- Child Protection: Safety and Security
- Promoting welfare
- Working with Children
- Staff and Governance
